ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY (EPA)

MARINE WORM:

The industry of marine worm digging ranks just behind soft-shell clams as the State's fourth most valuable fishery. Diggers in 1966 received an estimated \$1,227,000. The worms are used extensively in sports fishing.

Peaks-Kenney State Park, Rte. 153, Sebec Lake. Day-use only. (16,642)

Rangeley State Park, Rte. 17. Fishing, concrete ramp, floating docks, trailer sanitary dumping station, flushes, hot water showers. (22,867)

Sebago Lake State Park, Rte. 302. Ramp, bathhouses, boating, hiking, boat trips, trailer sanitary dumping station, beaches, tables, stoves. Reservations required. (266,556)
