



Daphne Winslow Merrill, born in Rockland and presently a resident of Auburn, Maine, received her B. A. and M. A. degrees from the University of Maine and did post-graduate work at the Middlebury Language School. Mrs. Merrill has been a secondary school teacher in English, French, Latin, and Spanish; Head of the English Department in two schools; Head of the Foreign Language Department in another; and President of the State Classical League of New Hampshire. At the time of her retirement, after fifty years in education, she was on the faculty of the University of Maine as Assistant Professor in English.

Mrs. Merrill has served on various State committees by appointment of State Governors; has held state, regional, and national chairmanships and offices in the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs, Inc.; has been a member and officer of Delta Kappa Gamma; and is one of only four Maine women to hold honorary membership in Sigma Beta Phi. She holds a fifty-year certificate of membership in Phi Mu Sorority and in the Rebekah Lodge, I.O.O.F.; and has been consistently included in WHO'S WHO OF AMERICAN WOMEN, in WHO'S WHO IN AMERICAN VERSE, and in the English publication of INTERNATIONAL WHO'S WHO IN POETRY which included her work in its 1972 anthology edition.

Mrs. Merrill's literary accomplishments have included State Contest awards in both poetry and essay work, published articles in newspapers and magazines, poetry in several anthologies, contributing authorship in books published by the Maine Writers Research Club of which she served two terms as State President, co-editing the 1968 Centennial publication of AUBURN — 100 YEARS A CITY, and the publication of two books of poetry, CONES FROM THE PINES OF MAINE and MORE CONES FROM THE PINES OF MAINE.
